We may be able to get it for you. We only deal with Texas native plants. If you request something that is not native to Texas, we will politely say so. This offer will end a week before the sale, but you can still ask.

EXCEPTION: 3-5 gallon/\$45 plants. Those plants and some 1 gallon plants are available online March 16-18.

4" plants are \$5 1 gallon* perennials are \$15.

6" Hanging Baskets (HB) are \$15 1 gallon shrubs/trees are \$25 3/5 gallon plants are \$45 & \$50

*Please note "gallon" refers black nursery trade pot sizes. The volume of a "one gallon" nursery pot is actually about 1/2 gallon. Similar ratios apply to "3 gallon" and "5 gallon" nursery pots.

TREES, Large & Small—Protect trunks from deer antlers. Water and mulch to establish. 1 gal = \$25 3/5 gal = \$45

1 gal	<i>Bauhinia lunarioides</i> ANACACHO ORCHID TREE Deciduous small tree, 6-12' H/W single or multi-trunk; Part Shade; Fragrant White/Pink blooms Mar - May; Low H ₂ O; Attracts Butterflies; Deer Resistance HIGH
1 gal	<i>Cercis canadensis</i> var. <i>mexicana</i> MEXICAN REDBUD Small tree or small shrub, Sun-PS, 5-12'H, Pink/Purple blooms March-April, Low – Very Low H ₂ O; Bees; Butterflies. Critical early nectar source. Larval host for Henry's Elfin butterfly, Smaller, more drought tolerant, with more curl to leaves than Texas Redbud. Deer resistance MODERATE
1 gal	<i>Ilex vomitoria</i> 'Hoskin's Shadow' YAUPON HOLLY 'HOSKIN'S SHADOW' Evergreen shrub-small tree, Low H ₂ O; 5-10' H. Can be pruned. Hedge/screen/specimen. Tiny leaves, very early spring flowers are extremely attractive to bees, red berries in fall/winter devoured by birds in late winter, Sun/Part Shade. Deer resistance HIGH.
1 gal	<i>Leucaena retusa</i> GOLDENBALL LEAD TREE Small deciduous tree in Legume family grows to 12-24' tall, showy yellow "balls" of flowers Apr-Oct, Sun/Part Shade, Low H ₂ O, Excellent accent tree in the landscape. Spare form, light feathery texture allows sun-loving plants to grow beneath it. Attracts native pollinator insects. Deer resistance MINIMAL
<p>A word about genera <i>Prunus</i> & <i>Quercus</i>: These are two of three that have been designated as keystone genera by Dr. Doug Tallamy due to the high numbers of insect species they support.</p>	
1 gal	<i>Prunus angustifolia</i> CHICKAWSAW/CREEK PLUM Twiggy, thicket-forming shrubby tree, 5-15' tall with fragrant white flowers Feb-Mar born in flat-topped clusters; EDIBLE SWEET FRUIT ripening to red in Aug-Sep. Nectar for bees and early butterfly migration, birds love the fruit. Sun-PS, Low to Med H ₂ O, Sandy loose soil. Often found near creekbanks in Wilco. Good fall color. Thorns. Deer resistance MODERATE
1 gal	<i>Prunus caroliniana</i> CHERRY LAUREL Evergreen dense shrub or tree 12 to 36 ft. Pyramidal to oval outline. Flowers very early spring. Very important early nectar source. Nearly carefree, dark green visual screen. Can be sheared. Moderate H ₂ O. Full sun/PS Deer resistance MODERATE
2 gal	<i>Prunus mexicana</i> MEXICAN PLUM Small deciduous tree. 15-30' H, Fragrant white blooms in early spring, Edible plums, Sun/PS, Low H ₂ O, Pollinator source. Deer resistance MINIMAL

4"	<i>Ageratina havanensis</i> WHITE MISTFLOWER Deciduous Shrub 3-6' H/W, Fragrant White blooms Oct-Nov, Seed heads provide winter interest. Butterflies, Hummingbirds, Sun-PS, Low H ₂ O, Deer resistance MODERATE Essential in pollinator gardens.
1 gal	<i>Aloysia macrostachya</i> WOOLY BEEBRUSH , Evergreen shrub, 6-12' H, Sun, Purple blooms March – Sep, Medium H ₂ O, Butterfly & Bee nectar source, especially honeybees. Deer Resistance: HIGH
1 gal	<i>Anisacanthus quadrifolius</i> var <i>wrightii</i> RED FLAME ACANTHUS Med sized, 3-5' deciduous fine textured shrub. Bright red-orange tubular flowers from summer to fall; blooms best in full sun, tolerates light shade. Can shear as a perennial hedge. Does well in patio pots. Reseeds aggressively. - Hummingbirds, butterflies, larval host. Sun-PS, Low H ₂ O, Very heat tolerant. Deer resistance HIGH
1 gal	<i>Callicarpa americana</i> AMERICAN BEAUTYBERRY , Deciduous understory shrub, Part/Full Shade, 3-5' H/W, White fruit, Blooms May – July, Medium-Low H ₂ O, Deer resistance LOW
4"	<i>Chrysactina mexicana</i> DAMIANITA Low growing evergreen woody perennial, 1' H x 1-2' W. Yellow bloom Apr-Sept., Sun, Very Low H ₂ O, Deer Resistance HIGH. Must have good drainage. Does well around rocks and concrete.
1 gal	<i>Dalea frutescens</i> BLACK DALEA Deciduous low shrub, 1-3' Tall, Sun, Purple blooms July – Oct Larval host Dogface butterfly. Excellent for pollinators. Low H ₂ O Deer resistance HIGH. Nitrogen fixing legume.
1 gal	<i>Leucophyllum frutescens</i> 'Legacy' TEXAS SAGE 'LYNN'S LEGACY' Evergreen Shrub, 3'-5', Silver gray foliage, purple blooms in summer, Full Sun, Low H ₂ O, Nectar, Butterflies, Bees, Cover, Deer Resistance HIGH
4"	<i>Pavonia lasiopetala</i> ROCK ROSE . Sparse semi-evergreen low shrub, Sun-PS, 2-4' H/W, Prolific flowers pink w/yellow centers April - Nov, Low H ₂ O, Butterflies & hummingbirds, Striking when planted in a mass. Deer resistance MODERATE
1 gal	<i>Sambucus nigra</i> ssp. <i>canadensis</i> ELDERBERRY Weak deciduous shrub, Sun-PS, Umbels of white flowers followed by clusters of fruit that are edible when ripe. Used for jellies, homemade wines, herbal medicine. H ₂ O medium to high. Deer resistance HIGH Plant parts other than ripe fruit are poisonous to humans and livestock. Birds love the fruit
1 gal	<i>Tecoma stans</i> 'Compact Orange' ESPERANZA 'COMPACT ORANGE' Deciduous shrub, 4'H x 3' W, Orange flowers Apr-Nov, Sun, Low H ₂ O, Hummingbirds, Butterflies, Deer resistance HIGH
4"	<i>Tecoma stans</i> var. <i>angustifolia</i> WEST TEXAS ESPERANZA Deciduous shrub, 4'H x 3' W, Yellow flowers Apr-Nov, Sun, Low H ₂ O, More compact and cold hardy than most Esperanzas. Hummingbirds, Butterflies, Deer resistance HIGH

GROUNDCOVERS & VINES (Climbers & trailers) 4" = \$5 gallon = \$15 6" hanging basket = \$15

1 gal	<i>Calyptocarpus vialis</i> HORSEHERB Perennial Groundcover, Sun – Shade, 6-12" H, Tiny yellow blooms March – Nov, Low – Med. H ₂ O, Butterflies, Nectar source, Deer resistance MODERATE
1 gal	<i>Clematis pitcheri</i> PURPLE LEATHERFLOWER Deciduous perennial vine, brittle—provide support. Long lasting flowers May-Sept. Bumble bees. Moderate soil moisture, fairly heat & drought tolerant. Dies to ground in Fall. Deer will browse. Deer resistance MODERATE
1 gal	<i>Dichondra argentea</i> SILVER PONYFOOT Perennial GC, 3-4" tall. Forms low mat to 30 in. across. Use as dense ground cover, falling over rocks, hanging basket or pot. Requires well drained soil. Will freeze back during winter & should be cut back before new growth in the spring. Medium H ₂ O; Deer resistance MINIMAL
4"	<i>Lonicera sempervirens</i> CORAL HONEYSUCKLE Evergreen vine, Sun/PS, 12-20,' Red/Yellow blooms Mar – Jun, Medium H ₂ O, Nectar Source: Hummingbirds, Butterflies, Regular watering encourages flowering. Deer resistance LOW
6" HB	<i>Maurandella antirrhiniflora</i> SNAPDRAGON VINE Part shade, 12-36' long, fine texture: Petite Pink/Blue/Purple blooms Mar. – Oct, Med. H ₂ O, Buckeye Butterfly larval host, Suitable for small trellis or hanging basket. Best sited where plant can be seen up close. Deer resistance MODERATE
1 gal	<i>Passiflora foetida</i> CORONA DE CRISTO Perennial vine, vigorous. Will trail over other plants or keep confined to trellis. Pale lavender-blue flowers open a few hours each day. Small fruit encased in filagree cage. Suckers freely. Fritillary butterfly larval host. Well drained soils, Low H ₂ O. Deer resistance MODERATE
1 gal	<i>Phyla nodiflora</i> TEXAS FROGFRUIT Perennial, prostrate growth to 6", partially evergreen in mild winters. Excellent replacement for dead lawngrass areas or as more formal groundcover. Small clusters of verbena-type flowers with red-purple center buds opening to white flowers. Sun-PS, Low to Medium H ₂ O. Drought tolerant and tolerates inundation. Deer will browse but not usually decimate.
4"	<i>Stemodia lanata</i> WOOLLY STEMODIA Perennial dense GROUNDCOVER, 4-10"H & W, Sun, White/Purple/Violet blooms April – Nov attract small bees (especially honeybees) butterflies & moths, Low H ₂ O, Fragrant Foliage, Deer resistance HIGH

GRASSES, GRASS-LIKE, PALMS & YUCCAS 4" = \$5 1 gallon = \$15 3/5 gallon = \$45

1 gal	<i>Andropogon gerardii</i> BIG BLUESTEM Perennial bunch grass 3'-8' depending on soil moisture and age of clump. One of the "big four" tall grass prairie species. Extremely high quality forage. Prefers deep soils. Coppery-red fall color. Low H ₂ O Deer Resistance HIGH. Seeds sourced from Williamson County PLANT RESCUE historic MoKan Prairie.
4"	<i>Carex texensis</i> TEXAS SEDGE Mostly evergreen low-growing bunch type sedge; 10-12"; good turf substitute for dry to moist shade. It can be mowed at a high (4") setting. Excellent for erosion control and low maintenance ground cover for shade. Moderate to low H ₂ O; Deer Resistance HIGH
1 gal	<i>Chasmanthium latifolium</i> RIVER OATS Perennial bunchgrass 2'-4' Low-maintenance shade grass, large, graceful seed heads that sway in breeze. Reseeds easily. Also good in pots & seed stalks used in flower arrangements. Blue-green spring & summer, soft brown most of winter, cut back in February. Moderate H ₂ O; Deer Resistance HIGH
4"	<i>Eriochloa sericea</i> TEXAS CUPGRASS Perennial bunchgrass that can reach 3'. Inconspicuous flowers stalks in growing season. A favorite of Painted Buntings. Moderate H ₂ O; Drought tolerant. Deer Resistance HIGH
1 gal	<i>Hesperaloe parviflora</i> RED YUCCA Perennial succulent, long-lived. Very heat tolerant Sun/PS, 1-3' H/W, Red-Yellow blooms Mar - July, Low H ₂ O, Hummingbirds, Deer eat blooms, not foliage.

4"	<i>Muhlenbergia capillaris</i> GULF MUHLY 1½ -3' with a distinctive seed head up to half as long as the entire plant. Purple spikelets create a deep pink feathery glow in the fall. High H ₂ O– not appropriate for xeriscape. Deer Resistance HIGH
4"	<i>Muhlenbergia lindheimeri</i> BIG MUHLY Large perennial, fountain-shaped grass. Silvery plumes late summer/fall are dramatic in the landscape. Medium H ₂ O Good for pollinators. Deer Resistance HIGH
4"	<i>Muhlenbergia reverchonii</i> SEEP MUHLY 1 -3' Dense clumps of slender stems and leaves. Old foliage forms distinctive curly tufts. Seed heads range from white, pink to beige. Native to limestone soils, often found near seeps. Medium H ₂ O. Deer Resistance HIGH Seeds sourced from Williamson County PLANT RESCUE historic MoKan Prairie.
1 gal	<i>Sabal minor</i> DWARF PALMETTO Fan-shaped evergreen palm 5-10 ' Usually stemless, the leaves arising from an underground stock can be as much as 4 feet wide on mature plant. White blooms are followed by black fruit about 1/2"wide in long clusters. Birds eat fruit. Tolerates heavy soils, poor drainage, deciduous shade. All H ₂ O, Bees, Deer resistance HIGH
4"	<i>Schizachyrium scoparium</i> LITTLE BLUESTEM Perennial tall bunchgrass. Basic component of prairies. Foliage colors range from blue-green in late summer to golden with cotton-tufted seed-heads that attract birds in winter. Reseeds readily so is not recommended for small gardens; best planted in mass. Give good drainage, little watering, and un-enriched soil. Low H ₂ O Deer Resistance HIGH
4"	<i>Sorghastrum nutans</i> INDIANGRASS Large perennial bunchgrass 3-8' depending on how much water it receives. Showy flowering plumes/ seeds Aug-Nov. A tallgrass prairie indicator species. Important cover, larval host. Medium H ₂ O, Deer Resistance HIGH
4"	<i>Sporobolus wrightii</i> GIANT SACATON Very large (to 8ft) perennial grass with attractive seed heads. Tolerates saline soils and wet soils. Erosion control. Good winter forage for livestock. Medium H ₂ O Deer Resistance HIGH
4"	<i>Tridens congesta</i> PINK FLUFFGRASS Perennial to 30" Seed heads from Apr-Oct have a fluffy pink texture. Occurs in areas where water drains in the Hill Country. Flat ground, swales, disturbed ground. Medium Low H ₂ O, Deer Resistance HIGH Seeds for these plants sourced from Williamson County PLANT RESCUE
1 gal	<i>Yucca campestris</i> PLAINS YUCCA Evergreen rosette, occasionally grows stem or trunk to 3'. Very slender leaves bordered in white with lots of white curly hair-like filaments Tall cluster of creamy flowers up to 2' above main stem Apr-Jun. Pollinators and larval food. Low H ₂ O Deer Resistance HIGH (Deer may eat flowers)
1 gal	<i>Yucca treculeana</i> SPANISH DAGGER Tree-like yucca, often branching above the ground. Leaves are thick, stiff, sharp pointed, 3 foot long by 3 inch wide. Giant, 2-4 foot, white floral spikes rise just above the leaves in dense, showy clusters. Both the Yucca Moth and this plant totally rely on each other for reproduction. Seeds from these plants sourced from Ft. Hood area. Low H ₂ O Deer Resistance HIGH

4"	<i>Asclepias viridis</i> GREEN MILKWEED Perennial with single clusters of white to yellow flowers. 1'-3' tall. Low H ₂ O requirements, Deer resistance is HIGH. Loves full sun and tolerates most soils. Will grow in a container planting. MONARCH BUTTERFLY CATERPILLAR FOOD SOURCE

4"	<i>Amblyolepis setigera</i> HUISACHE DAISY Annual, 6-15" H & W, Part Shade, Yellow blooms March – June, Low H ₂ O, Bees, Butterflies, Nectar source, Deer Resistance HIGH
4"	<i>Aquilegia canadensis</i> RED COLUMBINE Erect, usually evergreen perennial, up to 2' Showy nodding, red and yellow flower with upward spurred petals alternating with spreading, colored sepals and numerous yellow stamens hanging below the petals. Self-seeds when happy. Med H ₂ O Well-drained, poor soil. S-PS. Deer resistance MEDIUM
4"	<i>Aquilegia chrysantha</i> TEXAS GOLD COLUMBINE , Perennial, Shade/Part shade, well-drained soil, Robust yellow flowers Apr-Sep. Attractive nearly evergreen foliage mounds resembles Maidenhair fern even when not in flower. Med H ₂ O Deer resistance MEDIUM
4"	<i>Berlandiera betonicifolia</i> TEXAS GREENEYES Herbaceous perennial, 2-3' tall, striking yellow flowers with green centers Apr-Nov. Low H ₂ O, Part shade, medium soil moisture, reseeds freely, great for naturalizing. Deer resistance MEDIUM
4"	<i>Berlandiera lyrata</i> CHOCOLATE DAISY Herbaceous perennial 1'-6' with velvety leaves. Bright yellow flowers with maroon centers throughout most of the growing season. Leaves and flowers are chocolate scented. Low-medium H ₂ O, moist soil, drought tolerant. Deer resistance HIGH
4"	<i>Callirhoe involucrata</i> WINECUP Trailing perennial, 1-3', Showy purple cup-shaped flowers Feb-Jun carpet meadow areas, Sun/PS, Dry/Moist H ₂ O, butterflies, bees, Deer resistance LOW
1 gal	<i>Callirhoe pedata</i> STANDING WINECUP Erect perennial to 3', Showy purple cup-shaped flowers. Sun/PS, Low H ₂ O, butterflies, bees, Deer resistance LOW. Seeds for these plants sourced from Williamson County PLANT RESCUE .
4"	<i>Capsicum annuum</i> , CHILE PEQUIN Edible annual or perennial, 1-3' H, Sun—Shade, small white flowers May—Oct, Low H ₂ O, Attracts Birds, Nectar Source, Deer resistance HIGH—Use pods for seasoning soups and meats. State pepper of Texas.
1 gal	<i>Conoclinium greggii</i> GREGG'S MISTFLOWER Perennial Sun/Part Shade, 1-3' H, Puffy Blue-Purple blooms March - Nov, Med. H ₂ O, butterflies, esp Queens, Deer resistance LOW. Essential for pollinator gardens. Cut back after hard freeze. Can be sheared to control in growing season.
4"	<i>Coreopsis lanceolata</i> LANCELEAF TICKSEED Perennial roadside wildflower with evergreen winter rosette , Sun/Shade, Medium H ₂ O, 2-3' H Yellow blooms with yellow centers on single stems Apr-Jun, Butterflies, Bees, Can get tall and floppy in garden soils. Good for meadow plantings. Reseeds. Deer resistance MINIMAL
4"	<i>Dalea multiflora</i> ROUNDHEADED PRAIRIE CLOVER Perennial with woody stems, erect or sprawling, 1'-2'. Clusters of tiny white flowers arranged in globes to 1/2" Jun-Jul. Excellent species for native bees and other pollinators. Full Sun. Low H ₂ O Deer resistance LOW
4"	<i>Dalea nana</i> DWARF PRAIRIE CLOVER Perennial Low, upright, sprawling or trailing 4 to 16 inches tall. Yellow flowers May-Oct fade to rose color circle making a conelike cluster. Often occurs on dry bare soils. Suitable for rock gardens, areas of reduced mowing. Low H ₂ O Deer resistance LOW. Williamson County PLANT RESCUE .
4"	<i>Dyschoriste linearis</i> SNAKE HERB Perennial, low growing, 6-8" mostly evergreen. Small purple flowers present during the growing season. Needs good drainage. Pollinators. Low H ₂ O Deer resistance LOW
1 gal	<i>Echinacea angustifolia</i> BLACK SAMSON Perennial, 1-3', pale pink/lavender flowers May—July, Low H ₂ O, Sun-PS, Butterflies, bees, Deer resistance MODERATE/LOW. Preferred species for herbalists due to higher concentration of desirable compounds than other species in the genus.

4"	<i>Echinacea purpurea</i> PURPLE CONEFLOWER Perennial, 1-3', Deep pink flowers w/gold centers May—July, Med-High H ₂ O, Sun-PS, Butterflies, bees, birds (winter) Deer resistance LOW.
1 gal	<i>Engelmannia peristenia</i> ENGLEMANN'S DAISY Perennial, Sun, 1-3'H, Yellow daisy blooms March – July, Medium H ₂ O, Attracts Birds, Nectar source for insects. Drought resistant. Deer resistance MINIMAL
4"	<i>Eupatorium serotinum</i> LATE BONESET Perennial herb, can grow to 5' but usually shorter. Clusters of tiny white flowers arranged in flat-topped bunches Sept-Nov. Significant source of food for late season/migrating pollinators. Well drained soil in riparian areas. Medium H ₂ O, Deer resistance HIGH
4"	<i>Glandularia bipinnatifida</i> PRAIRIE VERBENA Low-growing short-lived perennial. Full sun. Rounded clusters of lavender/purple flowers bloom atop stems with highly divided leaves. Can be seen covering large wayside areas in spring and early summer. Flowers most of the growing season. Nectar plant for butterflies, insects; reseeds. Low H ₂ O Deer resistance HIGH
1 gal	<i>Hibiscus martianus</i> HEARTLEAF HIBISCUS , Perennial, 1-3' Sun-PS, 3" diameter red flowers year-round in mild winters, Protect below 20 °F, Low/Med. H ₂ O, Hummingbirds, Butterflies, Deer resistance MODERATE
4"	<i>Indigofera miniata</i> SCARLET PEA Perennial legume, prostrate stems 2' Salmon-pink pea flowers year-round. Full & part sun. Dry soils Low H ₂ O Deer resistance LOW
4"	<i>Ipomopsis rubra</i> STANDING CYPRESS Biennial, 3'-5' H, Tubular red flowers with star-shaped openings mostly May-July, but can appear during any warm period. Striking alone or in mass plantings. Sun, Moderate H ₂ O, Hummingbirds, bees, butterflies, Deer resistance MODERATE
4"	<i>Lantana urticoides</i> TEXAS LANTANA Deciduous shrub/woody perennial, 2-3' H/W, Red & orange blooms Apr-Oct, Sun, Very Low H ₂ O Birds, Butterflies, Bees, Deer resistance HIGH Trim to maintain desired size/shape. Essential for pollinator gardens
4"	<i>Liatris punctata</i> var. <i>mucronatus</i> GAYFEATHER Perennial tall-grass prairie species. Grass-like foliage. Sun, 3-6' purple spikes, blooms Aug – Dec, Low H ₂ O, Attracts Butterflies, Bees, Deer resistance LOW
4"	<i>Lupinus texensis</i> TEXAS BLUEBONNET Annual, 1', Familiar blue spike of flowers, March-May. Full Sun, loves limestone/rocky areas/ concrete. Very important food source for bees and similar pollinators. Disappears in summer. Reseeds. Low H ₂ O Deer resistance HIGH
4"	<i>Malvaviscus arboreus</i> v. <i>drummondii</i> TURK'S CAP Shrub/Woody perennial, Sun-Shade, 2-4' H/W, Red blooms May - Nov, Med. H ₂ O, Butterflies, # 1 for Hummingbirds, Deer resistance MODERATE
4"	<i>Marshallia caespitosa</i> BARBARA'S BUTTONS Herbaceous perennial, 8"-18" tall.
