PRICES and OTHER IMPORTANT STUFF

MOST OF THE 3/5 gallon trees are \$45 1 gallon trees/shrubs are \$25

In this particular sale, we have some 7 gallon trees, 2 gallon trees, and some oak tree plug/seedlings in multi-packs

Heights of plants listed is approximate height from the top soil surface. This will be how tall the plant is when it is placed in the ground.

*Note that “gallon” refers to nursery trade pot sizes. The volume of a “one gallon” nursery pot is about 1/2 gallon. Similar ratios apply to “3 gallon” and “5 gallon” nursery pots.

You will see from the following list that this sale is mostly about woody species. These are the most difficult for us to transport and stock in our in-person sales because of their weight and size. Offering them through this online sale allows us to increase the number of each species available in most cases and expands the number of species we can offer.

If there is a particular Texas native plant you are seeking that is not on this list, please ask. If it is available, we will have it reserved for you at the in-person sale.

Recycle your pots & flats--Bring them to the sale. We will get them to the growers who need them.

All proceeds from this sale support our chapter projects, including native pollinator gardens, field trips, trail signs, student outreach in Williamson County, plant rescue and terrific monthly programs.

3 gal	7'-8'	<i>Cercis canadensis</i> var. <i>mexicana</i> MEXICAN REDBUD Small tree or small shrub, Sun-PS, 5-12'H, Pink/Purple blooms March-April, Low – Very Low H ₂ O; Bees; Butterflies. Critical early nectar source. Larval host for Henry's Elfin butterfly, Smaller, more drought tolerant, with more curl to leaves than Texas Redbud. Deer resistance MODERATE Rootmaker pots
1 gal	24"-30"	<i>Cercis canadensis</i> var. <i>texensis</i> TEXAS REDBUD Small tree or small shrub, Sun-PS, 10-20'H, Pink/Purple blooms March-April, Low – Med. H ₂ O; Bees; Butterflies. Critical early nectar source. Larval host for Henry's Elfin butterfly, Deer resistance MODERATE
3 gal	5'	<i>Cercis canadensis</i> var. <i>texensis</i> TEXAS REDBUD Rootmaker pot
5 gal	6'	<i>Cercis canadensis</i> var. <i>texensis</i> TEXAS REDBUD
7 gal	6'	<i>Cercis canadensis</i> var. <i>texensis</i> TEXAS REDBUD Root trapper bag/container
1 gal	~12" (\$15)	<i>Diospyros virginiana</i> EASTERN PERSIMMON Medium size tree with very hard wood. Normally 10-15 ft tall in western, dry habitats. Females bear edible orange fruit 1-2" diameter. Attractive fall color. Birds, wildlife. Medium-High H ₂ O Deer Resistance MODERATE
1 gal	30"	<i>Ehretia anacua</i> ANAQUA 20-50' tree, larger and often evergreen in Zone 8b & 9. May be multi-trunked. Showy white flowers with bright orange edible fruit. Pollinators, birds. Low H ₂ O; but needs water to get established. Deer Resistance HIGH
1 gal (\$15)	12"-30"	<i>Eysenhardtia texana</i> TEXAS KIDNEYWOOD , Deciduous large shrub 3-12 ft. Bees flock to the flowers, which bloom at intervals through the warm months. Blooms heavily in spring & then after rain or irrigation. Foliage has a pungent, citrusy smell. Can be small tree with proper pruning. May temporarily lose leaves during a dry spell, but is drought-tolerant. Low H ₂ O Deer resistance MODERATE
1 gal	12"-24"	<i>Frangula caroliniana</i> CAROLINA BUCKTHORN Small to medium tree with glossy leaves; red berries for wildlife; larval food for Snout butterfly. Can withstand periodic flooding. Spring flowers not showy. Fruit is very showy, fleshy, 1/4 inch or more in diameter, red, turning black when ripe. Young wood will have thorns which gives some protection from browsing. Medium H ₂ O Deer resistance MINIMAL
3 gal	7'-8'	<i>Fraxinus albicans</i> TEXAS ASH . Large tree – 30-35' Attractive, densely branched canopy. Conspicuous fall color. Long-living, Fruits (female trees) ornamental. Male flowers showy. Pollinators, birds nesting/cover. Ignore hysteria over Emerald Ash borer. Larval host for Eastern Black Swallowtail Butterfly. Low H ₂ O; Deer resistance MODERATE Rootmaker pots
1 gal	12"	<i>Garrya ovata</i> ssp <i>lindheimeri</i> SILKTASSEL Medium evergreen shrub or small tree. When trained as a tree, can reach 15' Pink-green flowers in tassel-like clusters Mar-Apr followed by blue berries with a white coating. Dry, rocky soils, part shade, extremely drought tolerant. Native to Williamson County. Low H ₂ O; Deer resistance MODERATE Rootmaker pots
3 gal	3'	<i>Ilex vomitoria</i> 'Hoskin's Shadow' YAUPON HOLLY 'HOSKIN'S SHADOW' Evergreen shrub-small tree, Low H ₂ O; 5-10' H. Can be pruned. Hedge/screen/specimen. Tiny leaves, very early spring flowers are extremely attractive to bees, red berries in fall/winter devoured by birds in late winter, Sun/Part Shade. Deer resistance HIGH.
1 gal	12"-16"	<i>Leucaena retusa</i> GOLDENBALL LEAD TREE Small deciduous tree in Legume family grows to 12-24' tall, showy yellow "balls" of flowers Apr-Oct, Sun/Part Shade, Low H ₂ O, Excellent accent tree in the landscape. Spare form, light feathery texture allows sun-loving plants to grow beneath it. Attracts native pollinator insects. Deer resistance MINIMAL

1 gal		<i>Lonicera albiflora</i> WHITE BUSH HONEYSUCKLE Deciduous shrub to 4', sometimes twining. Clusters of white flowers Mar-May followed by red fruit Low H ₂ O, Nectar, Butterflies, Bees, Cover, Deer will browse. NATIVE PLANT RESCUE PROJECT. Williamson County
1 gal	36"	<i>Maclura pomifera</i> HORSE APPLE/BOIS D 'ARC Medium-sized, 36-72' tree; short, often crooked trunk; broad, rounded or irregular crown of spreading branches; Armed: single, straight, stout thorns at base of some leaves; Fruit conspicuous on female trees, green, the size and shape of an orange or grapefruit inedible for humans. . Low-Med H ₂ O; Deer Resistance HIGH
7 gal (\$50)	5'-7'	<i>Magnolia grandiflora</i> SOUTHERN MAGNOLIA Large pyramid-shaped evergreen tree known for large, fragrant white flowers during the growing season. Dark green glossy leaves with rusty pubescence underneath. A wetland species, must provide moisture. High H ₂ O; Deer Resistance HIGH
1 gal	16"-24"	<i>Malus ioensis</i> var <i>texana</i> BLANCO CRABAPPLE. Deciduous small tree with mature height and spread of 15'-20' Suckers and forms thickets. Soft pink "apple blossom" flowers in spring, fragrant. Yellow-green fruit, about 1" diameter ripen in the fall. Excellent species for wildlife. Sun, Part Shade Medium H ₂ O; Deer Resistance MODERATE Rootmaker pots
1 gal (\$15)	+/- 18"	<i>Mimosa borealis</i> FRAGRANT MIMOSA Shrub 6', Small thorns are prolific, Fragrant fuzzy pink blooms Mar-Jul, Sun-PS, Low H ₂ O, Bees, Butterflies, Nectar source, Deer resistance. HIGH NOTE: We discovered last year what we have been selling as <i>Mimosa borealis</i> for years is actually <i>Mimosa texana</i>
1 gal (\$15)	16"	<i>Mimosa dysocarpa</i> VELVET-POD MIMOSA Deciduous thorny shrub in Legume family. 2'-6' tall. Showy tube-shaped clusters of dark pink flowers fade light pink at the end of stems, slightly scented Jun-Oct. Seed pods framed by spines on edges. Extremely drought tolerant and must have well-drained soil. Songbirds like the seeds. Low H ₂ O Deer Resistance HIGH NOTE: We discovered this year what we have been selling as <i>Mimosa borealis</i> for years is actually <i>Mimosa texana</i> .
3 gal	4'	<i>Morus microphylla</i> LITTLELEAF MULBERRY Small tree to 25 ft. Edible fruit ripens in May. Smaller leaves and fruit than the larger Red Mulberry. More western species that tolerates drought, caliche and limestone soils. Attracts pollinators and birds. Low H ₂ O, Deer Resistance LOW. Rootmaker pots
1 gal	4'-5'	<i>Parkinsonia aculeata</i> RETAMA Small deciduous tree, usually to 15 ft, though may grow larger with favorable growing conditions, rarely beyond 30ft. Racemes of showy yellow flowers with a red "honey spot" that persists after the others have faded. Legume pods follow. Very tolerant of well drained soil types. Can become weedy in richer soils. Excellent nectar source. Very Low H ₂ O, Deer resistance MEDIUM. Livestock will browse pods.
1 gal	+/- 3'	<i>Prunus angustifolia</i> CHICKAWSAW/CREEK PLUM Twiggy, thicket-forming shrubby tree, 5-15' tall with fragrant white flowers Feb-Mar born in flat-topped clusters; EDIBLE SWEET FRUIT ripening to red in Aug-Sep. Nectar for bees and early butterfly migration, birds love the fruit. Sun-PS, Low to Med H ₂ O, Sandy loose soil. Often found near creekbanks in Wilco. Good fall color. Thorns. Deer resistance MODERATE
1 gal	30"-40"	<i>Prunus mexicana</i> MEXICAN PLUM Small deciduous tree. 15-30' H, Fragrant white blooms in early spring, Edible plums, Sun/PS, Low H ₂ O, Superior pollinator source. Deer resistance MODERATE. Leaves, stems, & seeds are mildly toxic to mammals.
3 gal	5'-6'	<i>Prunus mexicana</i> MEXICAN PLUM Rootmaker pots

3 gal	3'-5'	<i>Prunus serotina</i> var <i>eximia</i> ESCARPMENT BLACK CHERRY Medium to 50' deciduous tree with extremely high wildlife value. Drooping racemes of white flowers as leaves emerge attract bees and other pollinators Red, then black fruit highly prized by birds. ONLY the ripe fruit is edible to humans. All other parts are poisonous if ingested. This means Deer resistance is HIGH. Prefers calcareous soils of Central Texas Escarpment and some moisture. Medium H ₂ O Rootmaker pots

1 gal	14"-16 "	<i>Ptelea trifoliata</i> WAFER ASH 10-15 ft. tall shrub or small understory tree. Conspicuous flowers & seeds. Sun-PS, Low to High H ₂ O, prefers moist soil, found along streams in Wilco. Larval host for Giant Swallowtail butterfly, Birds. Deer resistance HIGH Rootmaker pots
3/5 gal	3'	<i>Quercus laceyi</i> LACEY OAK Medium-sized 20-40' deciduous tree. Mar-May, New leaves peach-colored, turning blue-green, then back to peach in fall. Tree takes on smoky appearance in summer. Good for small yards. White oak type/oak wilt resistant. Dry rocky soil. Low H ₂ O Deer Resistance LOW Rootmaker pots
3/5 gal	+/- 4'	<i>Quercus macrocarpa</i> BUR OAK Deciduous large 80-100' tree in white oak group, Mar-May, a fine shade tree, with golf ball-sized acorns. Large leaves, long-lived and fast-growing for an oak. Intolerant of root zone disturbance. Low H ₂ O Deer Resistance LOW
3 gal	6'	<i>Quercus macrocarpa</i> BUR OAK Rootmaker pots
7 gal (\$50)	6'-7'	<i>Quercus macrocarpa</i> BUR OAK Root trapper containers
plugs	12"	<i>Quercus macrocarpa</i> BUR OAK Seedlings in trays of 4" square tree plugs, \$5/plug, sold as half tray of 9 plugs(\$45) or whole tray of 18 plugs (\$90) Small holes to dig, the younger the tree, the faster it grows.
3/5 gal	6'	<i>Quercus muehlenbergii</i> CHINKAPIN OAK Deciduous Medium-large tree 45 – 110', Very attractive tree, shiny dark green leaves, relatively fast growing, relatively free of diseases and pests. Attractive fall color. Does best in well-drained soil and adapts to many different soil types. Low H ₂ O Deer Resistance LOW
plugs	12"	<i>Quercus muehlenbergii</i> CHINKAPIN OAK Seedlings in trays of 4" square tree plugs, \$5/plug, sold as half tray of 9 plugs(\$45) or whole tray of 18 plugs (\$90) Small holes to dig, the younger the tree, the faster it grows.
3 gal	5'-9'	<i>Quercus polymorpha</i> MEXICAN WHITE OAK Large semi-evergreen tree with medium sized leaves in various forms, 40'W x 60'H; Sun-PS, Med. H ₂ O; Attractive to pollinators, birds, and small mammals. Deer Resistance MINIMAL Rootmaker pots
3/5 gal	7'-8'	<i>Quercus shumardii</i> SHUMARD RED OAK ; Relatively fast-growing & adaptable. Drought resistant & also withstands short-term flooding. Similar to Texas or Spanish oak, but prefers deeper soils & tends to grow taller & straighter. Provides good fall foliage color. Medium H ₂ O Deer love the large acorns. Red oak susceptible to Oak Wilt. Deer Resistance MINIMAL
1 gal	15"	<i>Quercus stellata</i> POST OAK Medium to small (based water availability) tree in the white oak group. Irregular large dark green leaves. Low maintenance, slow to establish but long lived. Low H ₂ O, heat and drought tolerant. Deer Resistance MINIMAL Rootmaker pots
1 gal	16"	<i>Rhus aromatica</i> FRAGRANT SUMAC Irregular, spreading, deciduous shrub, 6-12 ft. tall, with velvety twigs and lower branches turned up at the tips. Glossy, somewhat blue-green, coarsely toothed, trifoliate leaves turn orange, red, purple and yellow in the fall. Yellowish catkin-like flowers precede dark-red berries on female plants which persist into March. Red-banded hairstreak butterfly larval host. Low H ₂ O. Deer Resistance MEDIUM

1 gal	12 "	<i>Rhus lanceolata</i> PRAIRIE FLAME SUMAC Deciduous small tree/large shrub Vivid red seeds fall color for weeks in any weather. Food for bees, mammals and 20 species of birds. Low H ₂ O. Deer Resistance MINIMAL when small. Rootmaker pots
1 gal	15"	<i>Rhus microphylla</i> LITTLELEAF SUMAC . Deciduous spreading shrub 5-10' in each direction. Small compound leaves give a fine textured appearance. Whitish clusters of flowers appear before leaves. Clusters of fruit are reddish and eaten by turkeys, quail and songbirds. Deer, sheep, and goats will browse. Very Low H ₂ O. Tolerant of a variety of soils. Rootmaker pots

1 gal	18"	<i>Rhus virens</i> EVERGREEN SUMAC Evergreen shrub, 8' x 8' average mature size. Orange-red clusters of small berries on female plants for fall color. Can make a dense hedge/screen or individuals can be pruned as small trees. Needs very good drainage. Very Low H ₂ O. Bees, butterflies, birds. Rootmaker pots
1 gal	2'-3'	<i>Taxodium distichum</i> BALD CYPRESS . Deciduous tree, 50-75' native to wetlands but does very well as a street/urban/shade tree. Bronze fall color, fine textured needles. Medium H ₂ O. Deer Resistance MODERATE Rootmaker pots
1 gal	18"	<i>Ungnadia speciosa</i> MEXICAN BUCKEYE Small deciduous multi-trunk tree with rounded form, 12-30', can be pruned to single trunk. Sun - PS, Pink blooms Mar-Apr attract numerous pollinator species, Low H ₂ O Larval Host: Henrys Elfin butterfly, Nice fall color and interesting seed pods are mildly poisonous. Deer Resistance HIGH
2 gal \$45	30"	<i>Viburnum rufidulum</i> RUSTY BLACKHAW Small deciduous tree/multi-trunked shrub to 15-20 ft. Can reach 30 ft. Flowers white, 1/4 to 3/8 inch wide, in rounded or flattened clusters up to 4 in. wide, Apr-May. Dark blue-black fruit loved by fall birds. Waxy leaves have excellent fall hues of red, lavender, pink, and orange. Good understory tree. Low H ₂ O, Deer resistance MODERATE
3 gal \$50	35"-40"	<i>Viburnum rufidulum</i> RUSTY BLACKHAW Nice bushy plants, Rootmaker pots
3/5 gal (\$25)		<i>Yucca campestris</i> PLAINS YUCCA Evergreen rosette, occasionally grows stem or trunk to 3'. Very slender leaves bordered in white with lots of white curly hair-like filaments Tall cluster of creamy flowers up to 2' above main stem Apr-Jun. Pollinators and larval food. Low H ₂ O Deer Resistance HIGH (Deer may eat flowers)
1 gal		<i>Yucca constricta</i> BUCKLEY'S YUCCA Evergreen yucca forming stalks 3-5. Narrow, stiff sharp leaves radiate from trunk. Large creamy clusters of flower above foliage spring-summer. Cold hardy, needs very good drainage. Drought tolerant. Low H ₂ O Deer Resistance HIGH. NATIVE PLANT RESCUE PROJECT . Burnet County
1 gal		<i>Yucca treculeana</i> SPANISH DAGGER Tree-like yucca, often branching above the ground. Leaves are thick, stiff, sharp pointed, 3 foot long by 3 inch wide. Giant, 2-4 foot, white floral spikes rise just above the leaves in dense, showy clusters. Both the Yucca Moth and this plant totally rely on each other for reproduction. Seeds from these plants sourced from Ft. Hood area. Low H ₂ O Deer Resistance HIGH Nice, full plants
