**EXCEPTION:** 3-5 gallon/\$30 plants. Typically, we only bring 4-5 of each species in that size. If you know you want several of a single species in that size, let us know so we can try to accommodate you.

4" pots are \$5 each.1 gallon\* perennials are \$12.6" Hanging Baskets (HB) are \$121 gallon shrubs/trees are \$173/5 gallon shrubs are \$303/5 gallon trees are \$40.

\*Please note "gallon" refers black nursery trade pot sizes. The volume of a "one gallon" nursery pot is actually about 1/2 gallon. Similar ratios apply to "3 gallon" and "5 gallon" nursery pots.

5 gal	Aesculus glabra var. arguta <b>TEXAS BUCKEYE</b> Multi-trunked deciduous tree. 10-25 ft height. Clusters of pale-yellow blooms; palmately compound, glossy leaves; and an open-spreading crown. Often loses leaves by August. Part Shade, Med H <sub>2</sub> O. Butterflies, Humming-birds, Deer resistance MODERATE Seeds and young shoots poisonous if eaten by humans.
1 gal	Aesculus pavia RED BUCKEYE Deciduous Shrub/Small Tree. 10-15' tall. Clusters of red tubular flowers attract hummingbirds Mar-Apr
	Distinctive palmate leaves may drop by August. Part shade. Medium H <sub>2</sub> O; Deer Resistance MEDIUM.
1 gal	Bauhinia Iunarioides Анасасно Оксно Ткее: Deciduous small tree, 6-12' H/W single or multi-trunk; Part Shade; Fragrant White/Pinł blooms Mar - May; Low H <sub>2</sub> O; Attracts Butterflies; Deer Resistance HIGH
1 gal 3 gal	<i>Cercis canadensis</i> var. <i>texensis</i> <b>TEXAS REDBUD</b> Small tree or small shrub, Sun-PS, 10-20'H, Pink/Purple blooms March-April, Low – Med. H <sub>2</sub> O; Bees; Butterflies. Critical early nectar source. Larval host for Henry's Elfin butterfly, Deer resistance MODERATE
5 gal	Cornus drummondii ROUGH DOGWOOD Small tree, clumping shrub. Clusters of creamy-yellow flowers produce hard white fruit. Important fruit for migrating birds. Tolerates dense shade but needs 4 hours sun to fruit. Screening, erosion control. Low-medium H <sub>2</sub> O Prefers moist soils. Occurs along rivers and streams in Williamson County. Deer resistance MINIMAL
5 gal	Diospyros texana <b>Texas Persimmon</b> Semi-evergreen shrub or small tree with very hard wood, usually multi-trunked. Normally 10-15 f tall. Striking gray bark with age. Females bear edible black fruit 1" diameter. Birds, wildlife. Very drought tolerant, dry soils. Low H <sub>2</sub> 0; Deer resistance HIGH
5 gal	<i>Fraxinus albicans</i> <b>TEXAS ASH</b> . Tree – 30-35' Attractive, densely branched canopy. Conspicuous fall color. Long-living, Fruits (female trees) ornamental. Male flowers showy. Pollinators, birds nesting/cover. Ignore hysteria over Emerald Ash borer.
1 gal	Juniperus virginiana EASTERN RED CEDAR Evergreen juniper tree. 36-72' H. Extremely adaptable after established. Fragrant foliage; blue berries on female trees. More common east of I-35. Deer Resistance HIGH
A wor	I about genera Prunus & Quercus: These are two of three that have been designated as keystone genera by Dr. Doug Tallamy due to the high numbers of insect species they support.
5 gal	<i>Prunus mexicana</i> <b>Mexican Plum</b> Small deciduous tree. 15-30' H, Fragrant white blooms in early spring, Edible plums, Sun/PS, Low H <sub>2</sub> O, Pollinator source. Deer resistance MINIMAL
1 gal	Ptelea trifoliata WAFER ASH 10-15 ft. tall shrub or small understory tree. Conspicuous flowers & seeds. Sun-PS, Low to High H2O, prefers moist soil, found along streams in Wilco. Larval host for Giant Swallowtail butterfly, Birds. Deer resistance HIGH
5 gal	Quercus sinuata var breviloba BIGELOW'S OAK Small tree/multi-trunked shrub; grows up to 20 feet on thin limestone soil. Deciduous. Early spring growth is toxic to livestock. Very Low H <sub>2</sub> O Attracts to pollinators, birds, and small mammals. Seed stock from Williamson County. Deer Resistance MINIMAL
3 gal	Quercus laceyi LACEY OAK Medium-sized tree on good soil, shrub-like on poor soil. Sun-PS, 20-30' H, Attracts birds, Resistant to Oal Wilt Very Low H <sub>2</sub> O Deer Resistance MINIMAL
3 gal	Quercus macrocarpa Bur Oak; Large 60-80' tree. Good shade tree with golf ball sized acorns, large leaves, long-lived and reasonabl fast-growing for an oak. H <sub>2</sub> O Medium/Low. Deer love the huge acorns. Attractive to pollinators, birds, and small mammals. Deer Resistance MINIMAL
1 gal 3 gal	Quercus muehlenbergii, CHINQUAPIN OAK Medium-large deciduous tree, Relatively fast growing and relatively free of diseases and pests. Attractive fall color. Does best in well-drained soil and adapts to many different soil types. Attractive to pollinators, birds, and small mammals. Deer Resistance MINIMAL
3 gal	Quercus polymorpha MEXICAN WHITE OAK Large semi-evergreen tree with medium sized leaves in various forms, 40'W x 60'H; Sun- PS, Med. H <sub>2</sub> O; Attractive to pollinators, birds, and small mammals. Deer Resistance MINIMAL
3 gal	Sophora secundifolia <b>TEXAS MOUNTAIN LAUREL</b> Evergreen multi-trunked shrub or small tree to 10-15 ft. typically. Sun/Part Shade, Very fragrant purple blooms in elongated clusters Feb-Mar, Seed pods, Low H <sub>2</sub> O, Deer resistance HIGH
1 gal	Rhus lanceolata PRAIRIE FLAME SUMAC Deciduous small tree/large shrub Vivid red seeds fall color for weeks in any weather. Food for bees, mammals and 20 species of birds. Low H <sub>2</sub> O. Deer Resistance MINIMAL
1 gal	<i>Ulmus crassifolia</i> <b>CEDAR ELM</b> Large deciduous shade tree g 50-70'H x 40-60'W Fall foliage yellow. Protect young trees from deer. Butterfly larva source. Cover and seeds for birds. Low H <sub>2</sub> O.
1 gal	Ungnadia speciosa MEXICAN BUCKEYE Small deciduous multi-trunk tree with rounded form, 12-30', can be pruned to single trunk. Sur - PS, Pink blooms Mar-Apr attract numerous pollinator species, Low H <sub>2</sub> O Larval Host: Henrys Elfin butterfly, Nice fall color and interest ing seed pods are mildly poisonous. Deer Resistance HIGH
5 gal	Viburnum prunifolium <b>SMOOTH BLACKHAW</b> Sturdy large deciduous shrub or small tree to 15' Part Shade. Creamy white clusters of flowers in spring develop into small yellow fruit that ripen to bluish-black in Fall. Fruit is eaten by birds and mammals and can be made into preserves. Medium H <sub>2</sub> O Deer Resistance MINIMAL

4"	Dalea frutescens BLACK DALEA Deciduous low shrub, 1-3' Tall, Sun, Purple blooms July – Oct Larval host Dogface butterfly. Excellent for pollinators. Low H <sub>2</sub> O Deer resistance HIGH. Nitrogen fixing legume.
1 gal	Leucophyllum frutescens 'Legacy' TEXAS SAGE 'LYNN'S LEGACY' Evergreen Shrub, 3'-5', Silver gray foliage, purple blooms in summer, Full Sun, Low H <sub>2</sub> O, Nectar, Butterflies, Bees, Cover, Deer Resistance HIGH

5 gal Sabal minor **DWARF PALMETTO** Fan-shaped evergreen palm 5-10 ' Usually stemless, the leaves arising from an underground stock can be as much as 4 feet wide on mature plant. White blooms are followed by black fruit about 1/2"wide in long clusters. Birds eat fruit. Tolerates heavy soils, poor drainage, deciduous shade. All H<sub>2</sub>O, Bees, Deer resistance HIGH

1 gal Salvia regla Mountain/Regal Sage Showy Deciduous shrub, 3'-5' with large red tubular flowers held by red-shaded calyx, Jul-Oct. Shade/Part Shade. Dry soil. Disease/insect free, drought tolerant; adaptable to a variety of sites. Once established, do not fertilize. It should be periodically pruned to encourage bushy growth and more blooms, which occur on new wood. Hummingbirds. Low-Medium H<sub>2</sub>O Deer resistance LOW

1 gal Sambucus nigra ssp. canadensis **ELDERBERRY** Weak deciduous shrub, Sun-PS, Umbels of white flowers followed by clusters of fruit that are edible when ripe. Used for jellies, homemade wines, herbal medicine. H<sub>2</sub>O medium to high. Deer resistance HIGH Plant parts other than ripe fruit are poisonous to humans and livestock. Birds love the fruit

Yellow 1/2" flowers Apr-Sept give way to over 1" diameter round fruits covered with spiny-looking covering. This is shed to reveal bright red fruit. Nectar insects and birds. Likes moist soil, Low H <sub>2</sub> O. Tolerates soil salinity. Deer resistance MODERATE.

1 gal	Wisteria frutescens <b>TEXAS WISTERIA</b> Strong deciduous high-climbing woody twining vine suitable for arbors. Sun/Shade, Purple/Violet/ White fragrant flower clusters boom with emerging foliage in spring, sporadically thereafter, Medium H <sub>2</sub> O, Attracts Bumblebees, Butter- flies. Much less aggressive than Asian species Deer Resistance HIGH

4"	<i>Carex texensis</i> <b>TEXAS SEDGE</b> Mostly evergreen low-growing bunch type sedge;10-12"; good turf substitute for dry to moist shade. It can be mowed at a high (4") setting. Excellent for erosion control and low maintenance ground cover for shade. Moderate to low H <sub>2</sub> O; Deer Resistance HIGH
4" 1 gal	Chasmanthium latifolium RIVER OATS Perennial bunchgrass 2'-4' Low-maintenance shade grass, large, graceful seed heads that sway in breeze. Reseeds easily. Also good in pots & seed stalks used in flower arrangements. Blue-green spring & summer, soft brown most of winter, cut back in February. Moderate H <sub>2</sub> O; Deer Resistance HIGH
1 gal	Muhlenbergia dubia <b>PINE MUHLY</b> Perennial bunchgrass; to 3' Small grass that will not seed out everywhere and it makes a nice mass effect when planted in groups. Leaves are stiff and rather upright giving the plant a tidy, formal appearance that is somehow soft at the same time. Sort of a dwarf version of Big Muhly Low H <sub>2</sub> O Deer Resistance HIGH

4"	Aquilegia canadensis <b>RED COLUMBINE</b> Erect, usually evergreen perennial, up to 2' Showy nodding, red and yellow flower with upward spurred petals alternating with spreading, colored sepals and numerous yellow stamens hanging below the petals. Self-seeds when happy. Well-drained, poor soil. S-PS. Deer resistance MEDIUM
4"	Aquilegia chrysantha <b>TEXAS GOLD COLUMBINE</b> , Perennial, Shade/Part shade, well-drained soil, Robust yellow flowers Apr-Sep. Attrac- tive nearly evergreen foliage mounds resembles Maidenhair fern even when not in flower. Med H <sub>2</sub> O Deer resistance MEDIUM
4"	Asclepias oenotheriodes <b>ZIZOTES</b> Perennial milkweed with clusters of greenish flowers born along stem among foliage. 12" H but tends to sprawl. One of the first milkweeds to leaf out in spring and last to go dormant. Low H <sub>2</sub> O, Deer resistance HIGH. Nectar source for Tarantula Hawk Spider Wasp. <b>CRITICAL MONARCH BUTTERFLY LARVA FOOD</b> .
6"	Asclepias texana <b>TEXAS MILKWEED</b> Perennial milkweed 1-2' gets shrubby with age. Attractive small clusters of showy white flowers showy against dark green leaves. May-Aug S-PS; Low H <sub>2</sub> O, Deer resistance HIGH. <b>CRITICAL MONARCH BUTTERFLY LARVA FOOD.</b>
4"	Asclepias tuberosa ORANGE BUTTERFLYWEED Perennial milkweed with clusters of orange flowers born at top of 12" stems. Low- Medium H <sub>2</sub> O. Needs very good drainage. Dies down in fall, often late to leaf out in spring. Deer resistance HIGH. CRITICAL MONARCH BUTTERFLY LARVA FOOD. Good nectar source.
4"	<i>Baptisia australis</i> <b>BLUE WILD INDIGO</b> Perennial legume that forms clumps 3' x 3' with blue-green foliage topped by blue racemes of flowers in Apr-May. Of special value to bumble bees. Can take several years to mature to make mature clump from seedlings. Extensive root system. A show-stopper in perennial borders. Low-medium H <sub>2</sub> O. Deer resistance MODERATE
4"	Berlandiera betonicifolia <b>TEXAS GREENEYES</b> Herbaceous perennial, 2-3' tall, striking yellow flowers with green centers Apr-Nov. Low H <sub>2</sub> O, Part shade, medium soil moisture, reseeds freely, great for naturalizing. Deer resistance MEDIUM
4"	Berlandiera lyrata CHOCOLATE DAISY Herbaceous perennial 1'-6' with velvety leaves. Bright yellow flowers with maroon centers throughout most of the growing season. Leaves and flowers are chocolate scented. Low-medium H <sub>2</sub> O, moist soil, drought toler-ant.Deer resistance HIGH
4" 1 gal	<i>Callirhoe involucrata</i> <b>WINECUP</b> Trailing perennial, 1-3', Showy purple cup-shaped flowers Feb-Jun carpet meadow areas, Sun/PS, Dry/Moist H <sub>2</sub> O, butterflies, bees, Deer resistance LOW
4"	Calylophus berlandieri BERLANDER'S SUNDROPS Perennial, Sun-PS, 1- 3' H/W, Bright yellow blooms Mar-Sep, Low H <sub>2</sub> O but watering in drought extends flowering, Birds, Butterflies, Nectar source, Deer resistance MEDIUM
4"	Capsicum annuum, CHILE PEQUIN Edible annual or perennial, 1-3' H, Sun – Shade, small white flowers May – Oct, Low H <sub>2</sub> 0, Attracts Birds, Nectar Source, Deer resistance HIGH Use pods for seasoning soups and meats. State pepper of Texas.
4"	Chrysactinia mexicana <b>DAMIANITA</b> low growing evergreen woody perennial, 1' H x 1-2' W. Yellow bloom Apr-Sept., Sun, Very Low H <sub>2</sub> O, Deer Resistance HIGH. Must have good drainage. Does well around rocks and concrete.
4"	Conoclinium greggii <b>GREGG'S MISTFLOWER</b> Perennial Sun/Part Shade, 1-3' H, Puffy Blue-Purple blooms March - Nov, Med. H <sub>2</sub> O, butterflies, esp Queens, Deer resistance LOW. Essential for pollinator gardens. Cut back after hard freeze. Can be sheared to control in growing season.
4"	Cooperia pedunculata HILL COUNTRY RAIN LILY Small bulb that sends up white trumpet-shaped fragrant flowers on 1' stalks after significant rain. Plant 8 inches deep for more flowers. Plant 4 inch/shallow to increase the bulbs. Low H <sub>2</sub> O Deer resistance MEDIUM
1 gal	Coreopsis lanceolata LANCELEAF TICKSEED Perennial roadside wildflower with evergreen winter rosette, Sun/Shade, Medium H <sub>2</sub> O, 2- 3' H Yellow blooms with yellow centers on single stems Apr-Jun, Butterflies, Bees, Can get tall and floppy in garden soils. Good for meadow plantings. Reseeds. Deer resistance MINIMAL
